# Finding Joy Amidst Loss Pastor Brandon Lenhart

The thought of my suffering and homelessness is bitter beyond words. I will never forget this awful time, as I grieve over my loss. Yet I still dare to hope when I remember this: The faithful love of the LORD never ends! His mercies never cease. Great is his faithfulness; his mercies begin afresh each morning. I say to myself, "The LORD is my inheritance; therefore, I will hope in him!"

How can a person find joy amidst loss? That's a tough question to ponder, but it's one that we should all have an answer to. Though joy and loss may seem diametrically opposite, there is evidence in Scripture that both can coexist in the same person at the same time.

Consider the passage from the Old Testament book of Lamentations above. Written by Jeremiah (one of God's

prophets), Lamentations was written during a time when the southern kingdom of Judah (the only remaining territory of Israel) was completely overthrown by the Babylonian Empire under King Nebuchadnezzar. During that conquest, the Babylonians not only invaded and overthrew the nation of Judah, but they also ransacked and destroyed the Temple in Jerusalem (the formal place of worship, prayer, and sacrifice for the Jewish people.

In the book of Lamentations, Jeremiah "laments" about the fact that the Jewish people (God's chosen people) no longer have a home or a place to worship. They are now destined to wander about as slaves and nomads scattered throughout the nation of Babylon.

How would you feel if the United States was overtaken by a foreign power, the sacred and familiar spaces in society destroyed, and you were forced to move to a foreign land where the customs were strange and oppressive, and where life was harder than you've ever known?

After much time in contemplation, Jeremiah remembered the faithful love of the LORD, and how it never ends! This GOD who had allowed judgment to come upon the nation of Israel because of their constant

disobedience and idol worship, still loved them no matter how evil and corrupt they became. This is how Jeremiah was able to have joy amidst great sorrow. This is how Jeremiah could lift his head toward God amidst great loss.

How do you deal with loss? How do you deal with sorrow and pain?

You see, joy is not something we have only when times are good, we can have joy in the LORD even through the bad times of

life. When Christ rules our life, even when bad times come (even when we encounter great loss) we can trust in GOD and know that He loves us. He too encountered great loss! Because of the joy set before Him, Jesus endured the cross, disregarding its shame (Heb 12:2). If He can do that for us, we can surely trust in His love for us!

Some do not yet have running Kaitlin hopes to have hand water. sanitizing stations installed in each of the five clinics in the immediate future.

#### Children of Promise

All children sponsored through Children of Promise are receiving home visits from their teachers since they are not back in school. School work and food are being provided! We are hearing that sponsored children in all 30 countries are being cared for well. Many food distributions are being implemented through the Children of Promise Emergency Fund.

**KNOW** – The process of baptism is the first step in the discipleship process because it is an indicator of a person's belief and commitment to Christ as Lord and Savior. It is also the public profession of faith which brings a person into fellowship with the community of faith. The focal point for fleshing out this first step is the worship experience on Sunday mornings at North Main. Because our culture understands that the Christian church meets on Sundays for worship, this venue is our corporate opportunity for getting people connected to Christ and the church (this presupposes that each individual follower is doing his or her part in being a witness for Christ in the community).

**GROW** – The process of teaching people to obey everything Jesus commanded is the ongoing process of spiritual, mental, and emotional development required of every follower of Christ. This second step in the discipleship process is not an end in-and-of itself, but rather a continual process of spiritual formation through small groups. Realizing that every believer is at different stages in their growth, the small group ministries at North Main are the catalyst for continual, holistic development in providing authentic community, accountability, Biblical study, prayer, and support.

GO – The final, but cyclical, process of discipleship is the element of ongoing ministry and service, which drives followers of Christ to step into the fullness of their God-given abilities and giftedness for the kingdom of God and His righteousness. Completely committed followers of Christ find it a privilege to get involved in ministry that connects the unchurched to Christ. They strive to plug in where they are gifted, and take seriously the mandate to Go and make disciples of all people.
