PEACE LOST

Have you ever lost something significant like a family heirloom, your phone, a ring, or piece of jewelry? There is usually a sense of anxiety, and maybe even desperation when this happens. We go on a frantic search and retrace our steps to try and find what we've lost. Finding what we've lost can consume us and cause us great distress.

Several years ago, when our youngest child was 2-years-old, we lived out in the country in

Fenelton on about 9 acres of land surrounded by beautiful rolling hills next to 422. It was the Thursday before Easter of that year and I was at the office Isaiah 9:7a (NLT) getting ready for the

business of the weekend ahead when I received a frantic call from my wife. Raelyn was missing! Needless to say, I didn't waste anytime getting home to help find her, speeding as fast as I could to get there. By the time I arrived there were three police cars in the driveway, and our search to find our lost daughter ensued. Oh, the desperation, the fear, the pain of loss was palpable and consuming. After about 45-minutes of searching in the creek-bed down below the house, in culverts around the local streets, over embankments, in ditches, we were nearly hopeless. And then. Going once more through the neighbor's yard and looking in the bushes around the

house, my wife saw her through the back door of the neighbors home playing with their dog. We finally could rest at ease and peace because what was once lost was now found.

This month, we will be exploring the loss of peace as we continue to navigate through the Old Testament.

The nation that had once been God's representative people (Israel), had so rejected Him, that they came under His judgment and punishment and lost their homes and land as a

> result of their rebellion. Now living as exiles in a foreign land, the Jewish people must take stock of what they once had, and all that they have lost, and come to grips with that loss in a way that they weren't

consumed by it, but rather transformed by it for the better.

As exiles, the Jewish people learned that true peace isn't a result of pursuing what they desire, but in surrendering to God's desires for As a result, the remnant them. learned to trust in God again. They learned that God would ultimately hold good to His promise to send a Savior/Messiah who came to set them free and restore more than land and property, He would restore them to life.

If you've lost peace in life, lean into God, and trust Him completely. Peace can be restored, and your life can be lived in hope!

WAYS TO BLESS A SOLDIER MILITARY CARE PACKAGES

We invite you to help us bless our loved ones serving our country!

We will be collecting items for the next several weeks to send to service members who are deployed. One of our church members, John Ward is currently deployed & we will be sending him & those he's serving with some care packages. If you know anyone who is deployed & would like to add them to our list to send a care pack to, please share their name & address with us. A list of suggested items is provided below. If you have any questions, just ask!

Items may be brought in anytime up through May 30th and placed in the box provided in Jump Start, or by the Welcome Center.

Thank you in advance for helping us bless our service members who so bravely serve to protect our freedoms.

SUGGESTED ITEMS

You may also include items that are not listed here, but it is recommended that you chose items that cannot be easily crushed.

NECESSITIES: Sunblock, lip balm, anti-itch powder, flip-flops, travel size deodorant, high-quality socks, lens cleaning cloths.

GAMES: playing cards, crossword or puzzle books, fun card games such as UNO

BOOKS: Pocket-size Bibles, devotionals, encouragement books by well-known Christian authors

STATIONARY: paper, envelopes, pens, cards, stationary, small tablets (stamps are not needed by military personnel)

MISC: batteries (AA and AAA), feminine products, nail polish, face moisturizing masks, lotions

HOMEMADE FOODS: cookies (packed in sturdy containers)

SNACKS: cookies, salsa, nuts, beef jerky, Slim-Jim's, non-melting candy, trail mix (in package not easily crushed), drink mixes in single-serving packets, protein bars, hot sauce (think Taco Bell packets) can be put in a plastic container to keep them from getting squashed, gum, mints, sunflower seeds.

WHAT NOT TO SEND:


Drugs or alcohol, aerosols or pressurized products, firearms or ammunition, perishable foods.

Reminder, it may take 2 weeks or longer for the soldier to receive the care package, so keep that in mind when deciding what to send. Another suggestion is to place food items in a Ziplock bag to keep them from absorbing the scent of other things in the care package, such as soap.

Have you ever gone through tough times, with great loss, and wondered if things would ever be the same again? Have you ever experienced difficulty and turmoil leaving you pressed, stressed, and needing rest? In the month of May at North Main, we will be exploring the theme, *"Peace Lost,"* focusing on the nation of Israel's defeat and exile in foreign lands. Over the course of these weeks, we will tackle subjects like:

May 2nd – <u>Peace Rejected</u>, (Isaiah 48:12-22). Key Point: "Peace is lost when God's ways are rejected."

May 9th – <u>A Promise of Peace Restored</u>, (Amos 9:11-15). Key Point: "God's desire is to restore peace to His people."

May 16th – <u>No Peace for the Angry</u>, (Jonah 4). Key Point: "Human anger destroys peace from God."

May 23rd – <u>Losing Everything</u>, (Job 1:1-22). Key Point: "Though we may lose everything, God's peace can still reign in our hearts as we learn to trust Him."

May 30th – <u>Gaining What's Most Important</u>, (Job 42:1-17). Key Point: "Trusting the wisdom of God requires humility which brings peace to the soul."
